


Who are Toyota Material Handling?




A Toyota Apprenticeship

An apprenticeship with Toyota enables you to learn how to inspect, maintain, service and repair all types of materials handling equipment including forklifts, warehouse equipment and automated trucks. You will also gain experience working with a range of battery technologies and truck telematics. During the apprenticeship you will work in different areas of the business and be supported by a mentor who will help you to develop your skills.

You will commit to a three-year training and development programme, which includes studying towards a mechanical, electrical and hydraulics qualification. In addition to receiving a nationally recognised qualification, you will develop skills and gain valuable on the job work experience. Training for this qualification will be a combination of college work and in-house training.

FAQ's

- Q How long is a Toyota Apprenticeship?
- A The Toyota Apprenticeship is 3 years.
- Q What will I learn during the apprenticeship?
- A You will learn how to inspect, maintain, service and repair all types of materials handling equipment including forklift trucks and warehouse equipment.
- Q What qualifications are required to apply for an apprenticeship?
- A Apprentice technicians require 5 GCSE's including Maths and English, as well as interest in electrics and mechanics.

- Q What qualification will be gained on completion of the apprenticeship?
- A Successful candidates will gain a Lift truck and powered access engineering technician level 3 qualification.
- Once I have finished my apprenticeship, will I be offered a permanent role?
- A The majority of successful Toyota apprentices will be offered a permanent role within Toyota.
